There were lots of fundraising activities throughout the year, with mufti days, clothes collections and the Wine and Art event, which in itself raised us a great €1,870. The Church gate collection in September was also a good fundraiser—€1,081.13. Mufti days raised €1,061 and the used clothes collections €490.

The money raised was used to bring activities and events to the school. We paid for yoga/pilates classes (€1,200), Communion party (€340), Christmas movie night (€540), along with other events and expenses. These included items such as, Tea and Tissues coffee morning, International Day, Grandparents Day, Induction Day, Easter and Christmas chocolates and graduation day tea/coffees and gift packs. 


